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## What is PPI?

## Study progress update



Five of six study timepoints have been completed. Most participants (71%) have reached the end of the trial, with less than 50 in the control

group scheduled to complete the final study assessment over the next four months. Thank you to all participants for their important input into the trial!

#### What happens next?

Participant visits will conclude in March 2024. We are working on three publications: 1) our main outcome paper, testing whether supported weight management improved Long COVID symptoms; 2) a process evaluation to find out what worked, for whom, what did not, and why; and 3) a health economic evaluation to check whether the ReDIRECT study delivers value for money. We are also working on an animated film to present our main findings. We look forward to sharing this at our stakeholder event in March (see last section on page 2).

#### Patient and Public Involvement with the ReDIRECT team

Jane Ormerod is a representative from Long Covid Scotland, a patient-led organisation which has worked with the academic and clinical team to develop the ReDIRECT project from the onset. Read on to find out about Jane's experience working with researchers on the ReDIRECT study.



"When the project began I was only a year into my Long Covid journey and relatively new to the Co-Applicant/PPI role. I was physically fragile and a little shell shocked from the Lived Experience of Covid. However, I felt welcomed by the team, which put me at

Speaking up within a team of academics and researchers is not always easy and it took a while for me to feel confident about doing that. However, a range of questions and comments were made about the project from a range of sources and I realised how important it was to represent the Lived Experience of people with Long covid with respect to their day to day symptoms, diet, nutrition and overall quality of life.

My role throughout was to ensure we never lost sight of that lived experience in ANY aspect of the research project, and to be confident about putting that view forward in any discussion. My confidence has grown, and I have enjoyed the learning opportunity. I like to think it has been a shared learning experience for all team members and continues to be. Which is really what co-production in research aims to be."

## Conferences

The ReDIRECT team has presented at national and international conferences this year.

In January, Dr David Blane presented the ReDIRECT study at an academic primary care conference (NADEGS) in St Andrews.

The baseline characteristics of the study were presented by Dr Laura Haag at the 30<sup>th</sup> European Congress of Obesity (ECO) in Dublin, the Nutrition Society Scottish Section in Glasgow and the EASO Winter School in Antalya, and by Professor Emilie Combet at Scotland's Health Research and Innovation Conference hosted by the Chief Scientist Office.

Professor Kate O'Donnell presented to the 51st Annual Scientific meeting of the Society of Academic Primary Care (SAPC) in Brighton about how participants in the ReDIRECT Study experience the work involved in taking part in the intervention.




Image: Dr David Blane presenting the ReDIRECT Study at the NADEGS Conference in St Andrews (Jan 2023)




Image: Dr Laura Haag in discussion with conference attendees at the European Congress of Obesity in Dublin (May 2023)
